There are 5 cordwinders. Most men are listed as "Labour"

Militia Companies listed are: Capt. Jonth. Virplanck, 23 men listed in 2 groups; Capt. Brown, 10; Capt. Teller, 8; Capt. Rogers, 10;

Capt. Lobdel, 10; Capt. Hyats, 9

Capt. Haight inlisted all.

Options for eyes: Light, Brown, Dark, Black [only 4 are black].

Options for hair: Light, Brown, Dark, Black [only 6], and Sandy [only 4]

NOTE: they had no pictures of the men, they needed description for deserters and notifications.

In the Muster roles of NY Provincial Troops" Ernest F. DeLancy, A Heritage Classic publication, lists muster rolls in the French and Indian War. I do not see your ancestor listed. That doesn't mean he wasn't there. People are listed one year, not the next, and then again are listed the following year.

But I can tell you that **Capt. Jonathan Haight had a company of men mustered in the French and Indian War in 1759 from Westchester County.** My ggggg-grandfather, Ebenezer Robinson served in that company. **They might have been in northern Westchester Co. since many of the people in that company later lived in lower Dutchess County.**

There is a mention of this company, and others from the area, moving out to Albany for a major engagement in either 1760 or 61. I would need to look through my notes.

1760 May 13- "**Joshua Lumerix**" "Inlisted 23 Apr - age 21, born in Westchester Co, cordwainer, Volunteer in Capt. Phil. Verplanck's Co." Inlisted by Capt. Haight Ibid. A cousin of mine Isabelle Cluff says he fought with Brit 18 months.

Later in a petition in Loyalist Canada **Joshua** says he fought with Delancy & was wounded & taken as prisoner. For generations this was thought to have been in the Revolutionary War. You say there was a Delancy group here in the 1760s?

I would love to hear more on this.

Peekskill is and was definitely in Westchester County -as Cathy Horn, the webmaster of both counties correctly states. However those who lived along Peekskill Hollow Road in Putnam County were frequently referred to "of Peekskill" especially by out of state relatives.

Moreover in the latter half of the 1800s the post office of those Peekskill Hollow residents WAS Peekskill (in Westchester). Both are buried in Cortland Cemetery (now known as Hillside Cemetery in Cortland Manor, N.Y.).

Would someone suggest most likely place for me to begin looking in Putnam County for his burial records? I volunteer at the Putnam County Historians office and I took a moment to look if your Isaac Ellis is buried in Putnam County. I found no record of him listed in any cemetery in Putnam. We have 1 very good source book "Gravestones of Putnam County". Contact me directly at my email for further information.

My Lamoreaux Family lived in Putnam Co. Pre Revolutionary War and they didn't record any of their deaths. Where would I go to find their records?

They were on Courtland Manor and the Phillipps Manor. I understand that these are now mostly in Putnam but they may have been in Dutchess or Westchester Co.

I am especially interested in finding **Daniel Lamoreaux** (after 1745) and his wife **Jeanne Masse Lamoreaux** (before 1744). He was also married to Aaltie Storms Banker, I would like to have their records.
