Man critical after fall



A Mesa man was in critical condition Tuesday after falling through a skylight while watching fireworks, officials said.

Var Rowley, 70, was watching fireworks from a rooftop in the 6200 block of East Orion Street when he fell through a skylight,

Mesa fire Capt. Cliff Puckett said.

Rowley fell 15 feet before hitting concrete and suffering head injuries, a broken leg and possible internal injuries, Puckett said. He was flown to Scottsdale Memorial Hospital-Osborn.

In one second, Var Rowley lost six weeks of his life.

The 73-year-old cast Messi man remembers standing on his roof in the 6200 block of East Orion Street last year watching a Fourth of July fireworks show with his teenage grandson,

His next memory isn't until September, when he recalls being wheeled out of Scottsdale Memorial Hospital-Osborn and into an ambulance which took him to a rehabilitation center in Mesa.


He doesn't remember falling 15 feet through a skylight onto a concrete patio. He doesn't remember being flown to the hospital. And he doesn't remember spending six weeks in a coma during which his wife was told she may have to decide whether to remove him from life-support machines. 'There must have been something up there I tripped on," Rowley said, still searching for an explanation to his fall. He said he doesn't drink alcohol and still isn't sure how he fell.

Rowley's story is scheduled to air on Rescue 911 at 7 p.m. today on KPHO-TV (Channel 5) in an opisode dedicated to miracle recoveries.

Eric Mathis, a segment producer for Rescue 911, said a film crew was shadowing AirEvac on the Fourth of July when Rowley fell.

"We got everything as it happened that night," Mathis said, "From what we were told, it didn't sound like he was going to make it. . . . It turned out to be a very good story."




